  - Rochester Rotary (tbc)

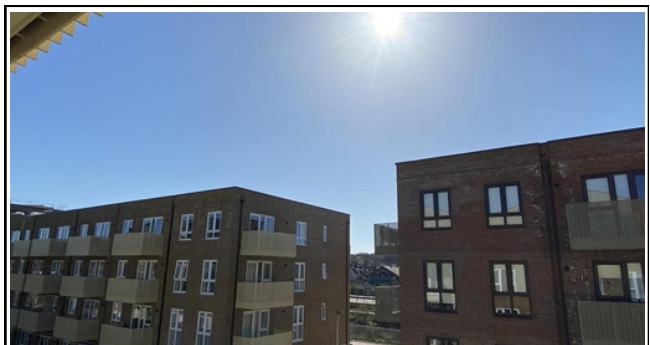


## Litter Picking

It's a really great chance to tidy up the creeks as well as have fun and meet your neighbours. Children are welcome as long as they can get down into the creeks.



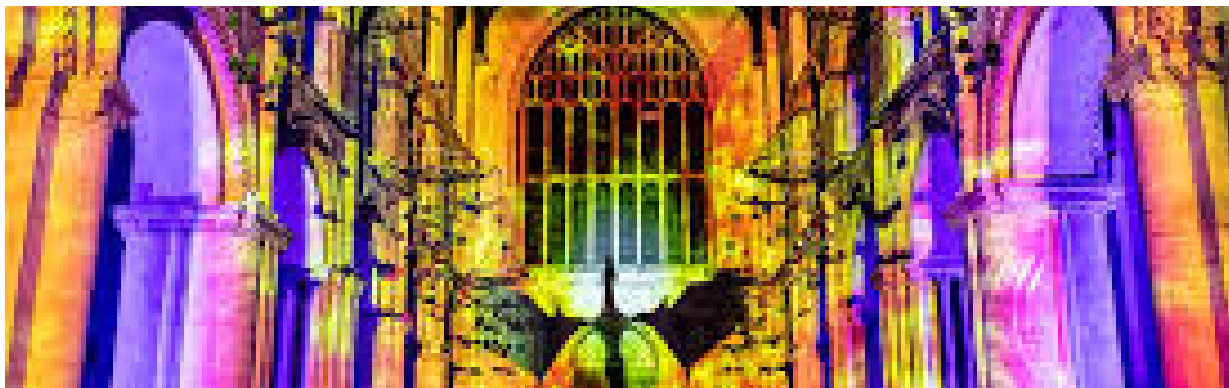
## Biggs Apartments and Blue Boar Wharf

### Biggs Apartments Leaks

This issue was escalated to the CEOs of Hyde and Vistry who agreed that Hyde would carry out the work and invoice Vistry. Residents have been kept informed and Hyde will advise on start date when known. Scaffolding has been erected to help deal with the problem. There is a new Hyde contact for the apartments: Michael Scarfe who is a welcome addition.

### Blue Boar Wharf

A new issue may have arisen regarding the brown roof and the cost of fixing this. Guy in BBW is very active in pursuing issues for the block and has already been in contact with Hyde regarding this.

## Development Parking

The majority of non-private parking within the development is category R1 requiring a visitors permit (slightly different near the park and co-op). The designated R1 parking is enforced under a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) by the council. All other areas should be double yellow lined. In order to ensure that roads can be adopted by the council, remedial work to rectify any inconsistencies (e.g. double yellows not extending fully) must be completed by Vistry. When phases are new it can take time for all the proper signage and road markings to come into force but once they are in force the restrictions apply to all - residents and non-residents. When Furrell's Road is open there will be yellow lining installed on the corner of Glenway and Furrell's road where the current site entrances is.



## Cory's Road Emergency Lighting

Feedback from Hyde regarding the replacing of the emergency lights system: Most modern systems are sealed units and require complete replacement if they fail. They are tested quarterly. Batteries or LED bulbs cannot be replaced on their own. The lighting is in constant use. It is not just for emergencies. Hyde have explained that a sinking fund has now been established to deal with such events. We have been told that the lights have lasted for their expected lifetime (around 5 years). Residents have an email contact from Hyde if they require more information and Katie says to let her know if you are not getting a response.





## Rochester Rotary and World Polio Day - 24th October 2025

Rotary International is celebrating World Polio Day on Friday 24th October. There are many Rotary clubs all over the world and fundraising for the eradication of polio is a cause they are very passionate about.

Hyde have very kindly given permission for the Rotary along with Residents to come down and plant Crocus's adjacent to the children's' play area in Furrells Park. Purple4Polio and planting Purple Crocus's helps to raise awareness of this campaign. This activity will be on the 24<sup>th</sup> October 2025. Timing tbc. ## Planning Updates

Amanda has been really helpful keeping up with planning over the last few months (and years). We really appreciate her persistence and hard work. She does a lot behind the scenes to address gaps in planning for the development. Gerry has also done a great service for the development.

We have received assurance from the council that work for Phase 5 and 6 (near the school) will not be commencing until Phase 7 is complete and both Doust Way and Furrell's Road are open. You have probably seen that Blue Boar Road is being tidied up. This will open soon (pedestrian only with emergency access). Work will be ongoing regarding opening Blue Boar Road for vehicular access but this will not be in the near future (a high amount of pre-commencement work needs to be undertaken).

### Eventide Park

This site is currently isolated from the rest of the development and can be the subject of anti-social behaviour and damage. The park currently sits with Vistry and they will be carrying out remedials but it will eventually be taken over by Hyde.

The timing could be more in line with the completion of phases 5 and 6.

### Furrell's Road Opening

This is due to be open by the end of the year. It is dependent on some final services work and the block currently under construction opposite to have reached roof stage. If there is any change Vistry will be in touch.

### Acorn Wharf

This development, to be situated on the far side of phase 6 towards the river has received the go ahead from the council. Further information [here](#). Amanda has been key in addressing concerns regarding Acorn Wharf.

### Adoption of Roads

All the roads on the development will eventually be adopted by the council. Phases 1 and 2 should have their roads adopted by the end of the year. Phase 3 remedials are ongoing and this phase is likely to be adopted in 12 months' time towards the end of 2026. The adoption includes estate roads, pavements and street lighting but not private parking courts which are managed by Hyde (Rochester Riverside Managing Agent).
